plato s euthyphro apology and crito portray socrates words and deeds during his trial for disbelieving in the gods of athens and corrupting the athenian youth and constitute a defense of the man socrates and of his way of life the philosophic life the twelve essays in the volume written by leading classical philosophers investigate various aspects of these works of plato including the significance of plato s characters socrates s revolutionary religious ideas and the relationship between historical events and plato s texts readers will find their appreciation of plato s works greatly enriched by these essays

among plato s works the statesman is usually seen as transitional between the republic and the laws this book argues that the dialogue deserves a special place of its own whereas plato is usually thought of as defending unchanging knowledge dr lane demonstrates how by placing change at the heart of political affairs plato reconceives the link between knowledge and authority the statesman is shown to master the timing of affairs of state and to use this expertise

in managing the conflict of opposed civic factions to this political argument corresponds a methodological approach which is seen to rely not only on the familiar method of division but equally on the unfamiliar centrality of the use of example the demonstration that method and politics are interrelated transforms our understanding of the statesman and its fellow dialogues

plato's dialogue *Cratylus* focuses on being and human dependence on words or the essential truths about the human condition arguing that comedy is an essential part of plato's concept of language's montgomery ewegen asserts that understanding the comedic is key to an understanding of plato's deeper philosophical intentions ewegen shows how plato's view of language is bound to comedy through words and how for plato philosophy has much in common with playfulness and the ridiculous by tying words language and our often uneasy relationship with them to comedy ewegen frames a new reading of this notable platonic dialogue

written in the fourth century bce *Philebus* is likely one of plato's last socratic dialogues it is also famously difficult to read and understand a multilayered inquiry into the nature of life *Philebus* has drawn renewed interest from scholars in recent years yet until now the only english language commentary available has been a work published in 1897 this much needed new commentary designed especially for philosophers and advanced students of ancient greek draws on up to date scholarship to expand our understanding of plato's complex work in his in depth introduction george rudebusch places the *Philebus* in historical philosophical and linguistic context as he explains the dialogue deals with the question of whether a good life consists of pleasure or knowing yet its exploration of this question is riddled with ambiguity with the goal of facilitating comprehension particularly for students of philosophy rudebusch divides his commentary into twenty discrete subarguments within this framework he elucidates the significance and possible interpretations of each passage and dissects their philological details in particular he analyzes how plato uses inference indicators that is the greek words for therefore and because to establish the structure of the arguments markers difficult to present in translation a detailed and thorough commentary this volume is both easy to navigate and conducive to new interpretations of one of plato's most intriguing dialogues

a unique interpretation of plato's account of moderation and the contemporary relevance of plato's ethical thought *sōphrosunē* is one of the four moral virtues along with wisdom courage and justice that plato discusses most frequently though it is perhaps the most difficult one for modern readers to understand while this greek term is often translated as moderation it is widely acknowledged that english does not have a suitable match for it this book interprets plato's masterful reflections on *sōphrosunē* in two of his dialogues *Gorgias* and *Phaedrus* author kristian sheeley demonstrates that plato depicts socrates customizing his accounts of *sōphrosunē* for the sake of motivating his interlocutors to cultivate it in their own souls by depicting socrates attempting to turn his interlocutors toward the pursuit of virtue plato aims to make a similar impact on his readers in addition the book periodically reflects on the

contemporary relevance of plato s ethical discussions as they pertain to fundamental philosophical problems that continue to confront us today plato s writings on sōphrosunē and related issues contain powerful insights that offer us invaluable guidance

the dramatic introduction in two of plato s late dialogues the sophist and the statesman both part of a trilogy that also includes the theaetetus of a stranger the eleatic stranger who replaces socrates is a consequential move especially since it occurs in the context of decidedly new insights into the philosophical logos and life together in a community the introduction of a radical stranger a stranger to all native identity has theoretical implications and rather than a rhetorical or merely literary device is of the order of an argument plato s stranger argues that in these late dialogues plato bestows on the west a philosophical and political legacy at the core of which the stranger holds a prominent place because it provides the foreigner the other with a previously unheard of constitutive role in the way thinking as well as life in community is understood what is to be learned from these late dialogues is that without a constitutive relation to otherness discursive and political life in a community in other words also of the way one relates to oneself remain lacking

previous scholars and writers have either celebrated the idealism in plato s laws or denounced its totalitarianism ryan k balot by contrast refuses to interpret the dialogue as a political blueprint whether admirable or misguided instead he shows that it constitutes plato s greatest philosophical investigation of political life in this transformative re appraisal balot reveals that plato s goal was to cultivate a tragic attitude toward our political passions commitments and aspirations
